California Long-Term Care Trends

- California's elderly population will grow by 60 percent between 2010 and 2023
 - » Californians are living longer and the state currently has the third longest life expectancy in the country
 - » Average life span of 80.4 years
- Evidence suggests that the baby boomer generation is in poorer health than those born before them
 - » More individuals in their 50s require help with personal care than those before them
 - » In the next two decades, the number of Californians living with Alzheimer's Disease is expected to double
- The average monthly private pay rate for care:
 - » \$6,400 for a nursing facility
 - » \$3,500 for assisted living
 - » \$2,300 for adult day care
- Rising health care costs may contribute to the increasing demand for informal caregivers
 - » Family caregiving in California was estimated at \$47 billion in 2009, far exceeding the \$12.8 billion in Medicaid spending for long-term care in the same year
- California may increasingly turn to families as a potentially cost-effective source of long-term care
- While demand for informal caregivers is expected to grow, the supply of informal caregivers is expected to decline
 - » Couples are having smaller families and having children later in life
 - » The increasing number of women in the paid workforce equates to a decline in the number of women who can devote their full attention to caregiving
